TALKING POINTS

- · Nicotine is highly addictive and can impair brain development up to age 25.
- Vapes and nicotine pouches are among the most popular nicotine products.
- Alternative-nicotine products, like pouches and vapes, contain dangerous amounts of nicotine.
- Teens who vape are up to 7x more likely to smoke cigarettes later in life.
- · Vape aerosols contain cancer-causing chemicals.
- Nicotine can cause or worsen:
 - * Anxiety
 - Learning difficulties
 - * Nosebleeds
 - Increased thirst
- Caffeine sensitivity
- Impulsivity
- Irritability
- * Mood swings
